

We had 54 members at the July meeting, which included 3 guests and 4 new members.






SCCQG News Linda St Jean, Rep

The block should be $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished. You can show me your finished block at the meetings, by email OR text/send me a picture of your block.




