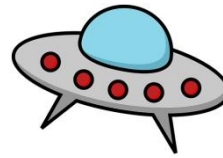
Needle Yakkers

Let's see how many UFO's can be completed!

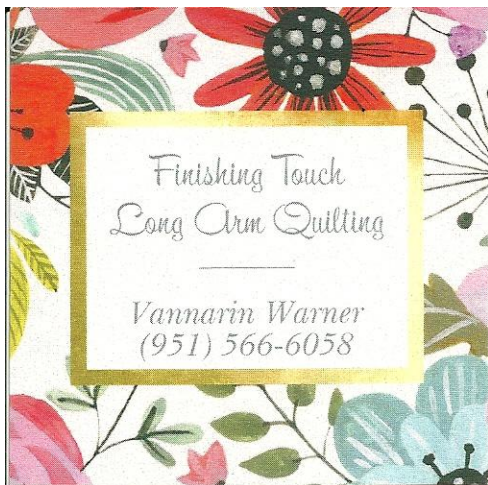
Show & Tell

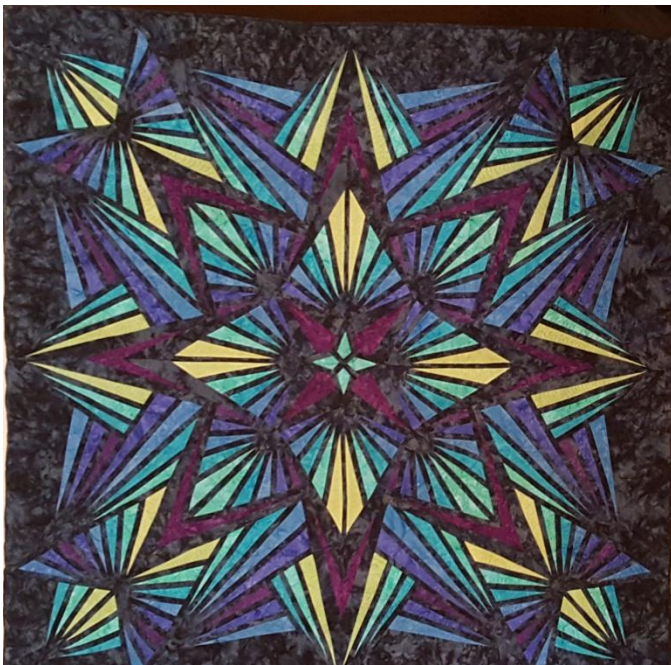
